

What is a medically prescribed diet?

A medically prescribed diet is one which has been prescribed by a medical professional. We require confirmation from a medical professional before any medically prescribed diet can be catered for through school meals.

What do I have to do to ensure my child gets a school meal which meets their medically prescribed diet?

Please complete the parent/carer part of the application form, arrange for a relevant medical professional to complete their part of the form and then return this to either your school or email the form to: specialdiets@tayside-contracts.co.uk

Are nut, peanut and sesame free school meals available?
