

What is it?

This project is open to ALL of S2. As you did not complete your YPI journey this is your chance to give back to those charities you have worked with over the last few months or new charities you have seen working to help support our local community since the outbreak of coronavirus. You **CAN** use the same charity and project that you had started on and add in more about the Covid-19 crisis and how your charity have responded.

YPI have created "Your Community Fund" – a direct **grant of £4000 to be given to local charities** based on your groups creative virtual projects. In teams of your choosing, you will create a virtual project (following all lockdown and social distancing rules!) to be submitted to Miss Dow by email by June 1st.

What do I have to do?

As a group you have to complete the following two tasks:

- 1. Virtually make a creative product (this is worth 60%) that must be submitted digitally, and follow lockdown/social distancing rules. The creative product should show what the social issues are affecting your community during the COVID-19 crisis and an understanding of how the chosen charity provides support to people affected by these issues.
- 2. Complete the information sheet (this is worth 40%): This document should provides charity information, highlighting their positive impact on the local community during the COVID-19 crisis. This sheet is on Show My Homework called "Charity Information Sheet".

What format can our Project take?

Simple answer – any creative format you want! **There is a help sheet on SMHW to see different examples called "Presentation Ideas".** You can click on the pictures to see video examples of what different groups have produced.

Some ideas for your team could include creating:

- Spoken Word
- Video
- Animation
- Dance
- Music
- An Infographic or Poster

What content must our Project include?

- 1. Show a general overview of what impact COVID-19 has had on our community.
- 2. Explore in detail a specific local <u>social issue</u> that has faced significant pressure due to the crisis e.g. food poverty, elderly care, mental health, young carers, domestic abuse, child poverty or any other social issue you feel passionate about that effects our local area.
- 3. Showcase what a local charity are doing to support the issue you have chosen how the grant could potentially support their activities during the current crisis.
- 4. Be creative!

How long have I got?

All submissions of both the virtual creative project and the information sheet must be uploaded/emailed or shared to Miss Dow by Monday June 1st.

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This is a <u>voluntary TEAM project</u> – it would be great to see all your hard YPI work pay off as much as possible and show that you can use your team working skills digitally to make a difference in our local area, you **CAN** use the same charity and project that you had started on and add in more about the Covid-19 crisis and how your charity have responded.
