Item 3 Approval of the previous minutes

The minutes from the previous PC meeting of 19 November 2019 were adopted without changes: proposed: Jim Cochrane; seconded: Elaine Hodge.

Item 4 Matters arising from previous minutes

There were matters arising from the previous minutes. The discussions are summarised below.

4.1 Duke of Edinburgh

Graham provided an update of the progress made on enlarging the team of staff supporting pupils in their attainment of the Duke of Edinburgh Award. There are six members of staff attached to the DoE. There have been two courses delivered by Chris Wood, centre support officer for The Duke of Edinburgh's Award, operating in Dundee and Angus. Grove has identified an expert to lead the hike for the Low Land Terrain Certification. The current priority is to get the store room sorted out which includes the cleaning the sleeping bags and water proofing the tents. The top cohort of pupils that will be supported are those bronze and silver level pupils that have done the expedition but not yet signed off their skills, sports or volunteer work. The next step is to have a soft launch of a bronze intake of pupils. Grove will have to limit the numbers, but as of yet no final criteria have been set or the number of pupils that will be permitted in the intake. To date no parental volunteers have signed up to get involved.

4.2 Parking and traffic

Jim provided an update on the issue of parking and traffic in and around Grove Academy. A discussion was held around the safety of pupils on Seafield Road adjacent to the school. Jim will communicate with Garrie Watson, Community Constable, Community Policing about our concerns. It is a parental responsibility to remind pupils on bicycles to wear helmets, visibility gear and cycle in single file.

4.3 Heating

In the previous meeting, Doreen raised the issue of the extreme temperatures in some classrooms. Graham reported back on the issue. Graham spoke with Chris, the head facilities

manager, who explained that they suspect the thermostat may be defective. Robertsons are arranging for a heating engineer to check the pipes that bring in the under-floor heating.

Item 5 Correspondence/meeting attended

- 5.1 No meetings were attended by the parent council members.
- 5.2 Doreen attended the Broughty Ferry Community Council meeting and said they intend to introduce an Information Notice Board in the Ferry that would be useful for information sharing.
- 5.3 Clare noted that the Grove Parent Council continue to receive regular emails from Natalie Mackland, Communities Officer (The Ferry).
- 5.4 Grove Academy sent out a letter to all parents entitled Secondary School Provision within East Dundee. The letter notified parents that the Children and Families Services Committee plan to start a formal consultation in relation to learning state option concerning Braeview Academy and Craigie High School. A brief mention was made that that the parent council should discuss the change in catchment proposal aspects of the proposal, but queried whether Children and Families Services Committee would possibly send officials to do a discussion/focus group with the parent council. No discussion was held on the topic. We put it down as an agenda item for our next meeting.

Item 6 Visit to China, Andy Creamer

Andy Creamer, Deputy Head, provided background on links between Grove Academy and China. These originate in the work done by Grove Academy's Advanced Engineering Team's participation in the ROV Competition in 2018 and 2019; especially our winning of the Marine Advanced Engineering Competition in 2019. The school was approached by IPERC regarding establishing links with schools in China based around the ROV program Grove runs. Following this Andy visited China in October and signed partnership agreements with two schools (Nanhui High School in Shanghai and Tangshan No2 school in Tangshan). From these partnerships Grove plans to develop a number of options for collaboration between the schools. There has been contact between the Grove ROV group and the Chinese ROV group at Tangshan already. Andy is also looking at possible options to source funding and support for the delivery of Mandarin as part of the curriculum at Grove and the development of these links offer a range of possibilities for pupils at Grove Academy. There is also the long term benefits for employment opportunities given the significance of the Chinese economy.
