when thrown into at the deep end there were some frustrations from parents and teachers alike. However, overall there was a determination of keeping education going from all parties – even the pupils.

Our young people virtually moved up a year and for the most this was a smooth transition. An awareness of a lack of equipment in households whether that be due to parents suddenly working from home and only 1 PC or not having the right equipment at all; remedies were sought.

Lessons have been learnt and whilst not all questions have been answered, mainly due to the 'not 'knowing' or answers are out of the hands of the school, the school year is continuing and educating our young people is paramount.

I would like to take a moment to thank Clare Jefferson for all that she does in her capacity as Clerk to the Parent Council. Keeping us informed and highlighting areas of concern that has come to her attention.

6 Report of the Rector

Graham Hutton, Rector of Grove Academy, provided a report to the AGM doe the 2019/2020 session. As follows:

In preparing for this meeting, I looked over my AGM report for last year and what hit me was how far things have changed in the last year, but particularly in the last 6 months due to Covid-19! What stared off as a "normal" year (if we ever have such a thing!) ended up totally abnormal and now we have the new normal which is different again. A wise man once said: "The only constant is change." Well that change has been a whirlwind this last year.

The session 2019/20 started off well, with very good exam results in the 2019 diet. In the Attainment v deprivation data for S6 in particular we could see that we had succeeded very much in narrowing the attainment gap. Our literacy and numeracy figures were up too. Altogether a good year.

Staffing was fine, with 6 probationers, 3 new staff and 5 maternities (4 of which have returned to work and 1 who has left to go elsewhere nearer home). And at the end of the year we lost Scott Paterson and Marjorie Kerr to retirement – both great losses to the school. Through the year we said goodbye to Gerry Dillon, Chris Taylor (RE), Jim Smith (Art) and Josh Martin (Bus Studies) and Lynn Barry (acting Business Manager).

Then it all came to a shuddering stop on March 22, when the country went into lockdown and schools closed.

We then had the challenges of On-line learning and all that that entailed. Lot of hard work was done and our On-line Portal has been commended across the country. Commend the staff for rising to the occasion. Yes, there were hiccoughs yes there were inconsistencies, but given the situation, our pupils were as best served as they could be. Engagement rate data from DCC post portal creation – 95%

Then we had the plans for blended learning, but despite all the plans, the Government decided to send us back to school earlier than planned on August 11th and we then had to adapt to the new normal. I shall speak about that later.

The lockdown, the Hubs and the pressure to get work on-line for pupils in a manner which they could access it, the desire to find solutions to whatever problems arose, the spending of our PEF money on more IT hardware for pupils without access to a device or the internet was as well designed as it

could have been, given the circumstances. And we discussed all this at the last Zoom PC meeting, including the plans for a blended learning return to school, which never materialised. They are still ready and may yet be pulled off the shelf, depending on developments in the near future, but from what I am hearing, the schools will remain open come what may. Throughout the lockdown, Mr Creamer, as acting Rector, played a huge part in the planning of all things Covid-related, whilst I was working in my national capacity as President of SLS. He has done a remarkable job and I commend him to you for this.

We were not able to do many of the things we normally do in the summer term. No exams, but a huge amount of time spent on moderating the estimates for the SQA Qualifications; no prizegiving - although we shall be presenting the prizes in year groups next Friday at a very low-key set of ceremonies; no P7 3 day Induction, but a lot of work done on-line and through teams plus a one-day induction when we returned in August with S1 in on their own for a day plus Buddies. It was not the same, but nevertheless, I am convinced we did the best we could under these precedented circumstances.

7 Report of the Treasurer
